# General information on filing an application for the designation of an officiant of a marriage or civil union



# What you should know?

To submit an application for designation, you must satisfy the following conditions:

- Be a Canadian citizen or reside in Québec;
- Be 18 years of age or over and able to fully exercise all of your civil rights.
- Speak French or English;
- Not be under tutorship or curatorship, or under the protection of an adviser to a person of full age;
- Have complied with your obligations as an officiant for a previous marriage or civil union, if applicable.

Eligibility to file an application does not necessarily mean the Directeur de l'état civil will grant the designation.

When analyzing your application, the Directeur de l'état civil will contact you to verify that you meet the eligibility criteria and inform you of your obligations as an officiant.

A maximum of three specific designations may be granted to the same officiant, subject to exceptions.

The Directeur de l'état civil has jurisdiction to designate an officiant for a marriage or civil union in Québec only.

If you are authorized to solemnize the marriage or civil union of the persons named on the application on the scheduled day and at the planned location of the ceremony, you will be mailed your officiant kit containing all of the necessary documents.

#### Processing time for an application

We recommend that you allow **approximately four months** before the scheduled date of the event for your application to be processed. The processing time for an application for designation varies according to the complexity of the file and the number of applications being processed.

# Responsibilities of the officiant

If your application is granted, as officiant, you will be responsible for ensuring that certain legal formalities are complied with before, during and after solemnization.

# Differences between marriage and civil union

You must indicate the type of union on the form, either marriage or civil union. The rights and obligations that stem from these two types of unions are the same. There are differences, however, with respect to the required age and the dissolution process.

#### Marriage

Marriage is a solemn act by which two persons publicly express their free and enlightened consent to live together and comply with the rights and obligations related to this civil status, as conferred by law.

# Civil union

Civil union status was created in 2002, particularly to allow the union of same-sex spouses. It still exists, although same-sex couples have been able to marry since 2005.

A civil union is a solemn act by which two persons publicly express their free and enlightened consent to live together and comply with the rights and obligations related to this civil status.

However, unlike marriage, a civil union is valid in Québec only. Consequently, if a couple in a civil union wishes to settle outside Québec, they should consult a legal advisor in order to prevent unfortunate consequences in the event of death or breakup.
